In the table entitled “Global Health Programs” on page 55 of the report, strike “Unallocated.....77,000”.

In the table entitled “Global Health Programs” on page 55 of the report, under “Family Planning and Reproductive Health” strike “461,000” and insert “538,000”.

On page 57 of the report strike everything under the heading “Family Planning/Reproductive Health” and insert:

“The Committee recommends a total of \$612,600,000 in the act for family planning and reproductive health programs, including \$538,000,000 under this heading, \$39,600,000 under the ESF heading, and \$35,000,000 for the United Nations Population Fund.”

6 health, including in areas where population growth threat-
7 ens biodiversity or endangered species.”.

1 On page 271, strike lines 1 through 14 and insert
2 the following:

5 SEC. 7063. (a) UNITED NATIONS POPULATION
6 FUND.—

7 (1) CONTRIBUTION.—Of the amounts made
8 available under the heading “INTERNATIONAL ORGA-
9 NIZATIONS AND PROGRAMS” in this Act for fiscal
10 year 2016, \$35,000,000 shall be made available for
11 the United Nations Population Fund (referred to in
12 this section as “UNFPA”).

13 (2) AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.—Amounts appro-
14 priated under this Act for UNFPA that are not
15 made available for UNFPA because of the operation
16 of any provision of law shall be transferred to the
17 “GLOBAL HEALTH PROGRAMS” account and shall be
18 made available for family planning, maternal, and
19 reproductive health activities, subject to the regular
20 notification procedures of the Committees on Appro-
21 priations.

22 (3) PROHIBITION ON USE OF FUNDS IN
23 CHINA.—None of the amounts made available under
24 this Act may be used by UNFPA for a country pro-
25 gram in the People’s Republic of China.

1 (4) CONDITIONS ON AVAILABILITY OF
2 FUNDS.—Amounts made available under this Act for
3 UNFPA may not be made available unless—

4 (A) UNFPA maintains such amounts in
5 an account that is separate from other UNFPA
6 accounts and does not commingle such funds
7 with other funds; and

8 (B) UNFPA does not fund abortions.

9 (b) ASSISTANCE FOR FOREIGN NONGOVERNMENTAL
10 ORGANIZATIONS.—The Foreign Assistance Act of 1961
11 (22 U.S.C. 2151 et seq.) is amended by inserting after
12 section 104C the following:

13 **“SEC. 104D. ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSISTANCE.**

14 “Notwithstanding any other provision of law, regula-
15 tion, or policy, in determining eligibility for assistance
16 under sections 104, 104A, 104B, and 104C, a foreign non-
17 governmental organization—

18 “(1) shall not be ineligible for such assistance
19 solely on the basis of health or medical services, in-
20 cluding counseling and referral services, provided by
21 such organization with non-United States Govern-
22 ment funds if such services—

23 “(A) are permitted in the country in which
24 they are being provided; and

1 “(B) would not violate United States law if
2 provided in the United States; and
3 “(2) shall not be subject to requirements relat-
4 ing to the use of non-United States Government
5 funds for advocacy and lobbying activities other than
6 those that apply to United States nongovernmental
7 organizations receiving assistance under this part.”.
